#### THE OHIO CUP IS A FESTIVAL

The Ohio Cup matches are played as a three-day festival rather than a tournament. The emphasis is on celebrating the wonderful game of vintage base ball and the joy of playing the 1860s-era version of the national pastime. Matches are time-limited (rather than the customary nine innings) so that teams have the opportunity to play a number of opponents, some of which have traveled a great distance.

In its early years, the Ohio Cup was played as a tournament. But in the traditional bracket format, Ohio teams that had already played each other several times during the summer often played each other again, thereby missing out on the opportunity to get acquainted with our out-of-state guests. The bracket format also made it difficult for visiting teams to make travel plans since they did not know in advance what times their games would be played. Most importantly, it was felt that playing for a tournament championship places too much emphasis on winning at the expense of the general spirit of good sportsmanship and camaraderie that characterizes vintage base ball and the Ohio Cup.

The festival format has proven to be a great success, creating a colorful, educational, and sportsmanlike setting for participants and spectators to step back in time and experience base ball as it was meant to be played, by gentlemen (and ladies).

#### A BRIEF TIMELINE

- **1992** The 1st Ohio Cup was on Memorial Day weekend. Participants included two Ohio Village Muffins teams (Hurlers and Strikers), Kent Base Ball Club and the Great Black Swamp Frogs.
- 1993 The Ohio Cup was moved to the weekend following Labor Day.
  There were Friday, Saturday and Sunday matches. Participants included eight clubs: Kentucky Pioneers, Middletown Laurels,
  Great Black Swamp Frogs, Sharon Woods Shamrocks, Carriage
  Hill Farm Clod Busters, Deep River Grinders and the Ohio Village
  Muffins (Hurlers and Strikers).
- 1994 The format was changed to a festival rather than a tournament and moved to Labor Day weekend. Participants numbered nine clubs (including the Colorado Vintage Base Ball Club and the Greenfield Lah-De-Dahs), as well as the debut of the Ohio Village Diamonds.
- 1995 Participants included 12 clubs, adding the Canal Fulton Mules, Sycamore Grasshoppers and the first appearance by the National City 45s.
- 1997 Participants included 15 clubs, adding the Rock Springs Ground Squirrels with their feared "chi chi chi" battle call and the 1922 Giants. The first soiree and potluck dinner was held on Saturday night.
- 1997 Participation gradually increased from 15 clubs to 30 clubs,
  2023 coming from Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri,
  Indiana, Minnesota, Tennessee, Illinois, Florida and more.
