The following information is requested to document professional qualifications meeting the requirements of the federal government, as stated in The Secretary of the Interior's Proposed "Historic Preservation Professional Qualification Standards" for Historic Landscape Architecture prepared by the National Park Service in response to the 1992 amendments to the National Historic Preservation Act (Pub. L. 102-575). The National Park Service has not formally adopted the qualifications for Historic Landscape Architecture; however, the Ohio Historic Preservation Office uses these proposed standards to review individual's qualifications for inclusion in its list of consultants that is made available to the public.

Historic Landscape Architecture is the practice of applying artistic and scientific principles to the research, planning, design and management of both natural and built environments with specialized training in the principles, theories, concepts, methods and techniques of preserving cultural landscapes.

The minimum professional qualifications are a Masters degree in Landscape Architecture with relevant course work plus two years of full-time professional experience and relevant products and activities, or a four-year or five-year Bachelors degree in Landscape Architecture plus three years of full-time professional experience, or a State Government-recognized license to practice Landscape Architecture plus two years of full-time professional experience.

Professional experience must demonstrate application of the theories, methods, and practices of Landscape Architecture that enable professional judgments to be made about the identification, evaluation, documentation, registration, or treatment of historic properties in the United States. Relevant work products must demonstrate the successful application of acquired proficiencies in the discipline to the practice of historic preservation.

1. Submit your documentation to the State Historic Preservation Office by email: **shpo@ohiohistory.org** 

2. The State Historic Preservation Office will review your documentation and provide you with our opinion as to whether your qualifications meet the standards established by the National Park Service.

3. Our office reviews applications on a monthly basis. **Deadline for the monthly review is the second Thursday of the month.** Applications received after that date will not be reviewed until the following month.

4. You will receive a notification email for payment after review. The annual subscription fee is **\$75**. Subscription to the Consultant List is on a state fiscal year (July 1st - June 30th). You will recieve a renewal notification email each year in June for the upcoming state fiscal year.
